








AP Fracture Repair

IVDD: Dr. Stauffer offers Hemilaminectomy for patients 20 pounds and under. Myelography is used as the diagnostic locator for the lesion prior to hemilaminectomy. Myelography is not as sensitive, nor as specific for lesion location as CT or MRI, however, it is a good diagnostic tool for those owners who have cost concerns associated with advanced imagery.
